As BCBAs, we are often asked to collaborate with a wellestablished school team in consultation for a client. This relationship can sometimes be challenging as our role in these contexts varies from conducting FBAs for isolated cases, to outside consulting for a home ABA program, or even advocating as an outside observer. In this workshop, you will learn to identify barriers to and strategies for effective collaboration; explore different models of decision making when making recommendations for clients in school settings; identify prospective roles of BCBAs in educational settings, and; problem solve a variety of scenarios related to working with school professionals. This intermediate level workshop is for those seeking strategies for more effective and positive relationships outside of isolated clinical settings.
